## **Annual Performance Report**

### **Introduction**

#### **2014-15**

*Texas Education Code Chapter 39* requires each district's board of trustees to publish an annual report that includes the TAPR, campus performance objectives, a report of violent or criminal incidents, and information received under Texas Education Code §51.403(e) from the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board. The Board of Trustees shall hold a hearing for public discussion of the report, and they shall widely disseminate the report within the district.

### **The Conroe ISD Annual Report includes the following:**

- The Texas Academic Performance Report (TAPR) including the District Bilingual/ESOL Report
- The PEIMS Financial Standards Report (2013-14)
- The Campus Performance Objectives (Campus Improvement Plans)
- Report on Violent or Criminal Incidents including our policies and procedures for violence intervention
- Report on Graduates Enrolled in Texas Institutions of Higher Education includes student enrollment and academic performance in postsecondary institutions during the first year enrolled after high school graduation

The district is responsible for finding the most efficient and cost-effective method of making the annual TAPRs available to the public. Therefore, the TAPR is available to the public through the Conroe ISD website at <http://www.conroeisd.net/academic/accountability.asp>. To accommodate members of the public without internet access, a copy of the full TAPR is available at each CISD campus and at the Montgomery County public library.

### **New and Continued Reporting Requirements:**

#### **2014-15 Texas Academic Performance Report (TAPR)**

(Information from 2014-15 TAPR Glossary and 2014-15 Accountability Manual, Chapter 1)

#### **1. STAAR**



The State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR) results include the outcomes on the STAAR tests given to grades 3-8 combined with the EOC performance; the cumulative passing rate from the first and second administrations for grades 5 and 8 reading and mathematics; and the cumulative performance from EOC assessments administered in July 2014, December 2014, and spring 2015.

The 2015 TAPR shows student performance on the STAAR in different ways:

- **STAAR by Grade and Subject**
  - Reading grades 3-8
  - Writing grades 4 and 7
  - Social Studies grade 8
  - Science grades 5 and 8
- **STAAR by End-of Course (EOC) Subject**
  - English I and II
  - Algebra I
  - Biology
  - U.S. History
- **STAAR Summed Across Grades:**
  - *Percent at Phase-in Satisfactory Standard or Above (All Grades)*. This measure was part of determining the score for Indexes 1 and 3. The first measure under this indicator, *All Subjects*, combines all subjects and all grades.
  - *Percent at Postsecondary Readiness Standard (on two or more subjects)*. This measure was part of determining the score for Index 4.
  - *Percent at Advanced Standard*. This measure was part of determining the score for Index 3.
  - *Percent at Met or Exceeded Progress*. This measure was part of determining the score for Index 2.
  - *Percent at Exceeded Progress only*. This measure was part of determining the score for Index 2.
  - *Progress of Prior Year STAAR Failers*, Summed for Grades 4-8 for Reading.

**Spanish STAAR** All STAAR tests in grades 3, 4, and 5 are available in either English or Spanish. The TAPR performance shown includes performance on the Spanish STAAR tests.

**Student Success Initiative (SSI)** shows the following for each SSI grade and subject: (1) Students Meeting Phase-in 1 Level II Standard on First STAAR Administration; (2) Students Requiring Accelerated Instruction; (3) STAAR Cumulative Met Standard; (4) STAAR Failers Promoted by Grade Placement Committee (GPC); and (5) STAAR Met Standard (Failed in Previous Year) for those that were promoted and passed in 2015, and for those that were retained and passed in 2015.

**STAAR Participation Rate** The *Participation Rate* provides the percent of tests that were included in accountability, not included in accountability, and not tested. Note that the percents shown are rounded to whole numbers.

**Special Education** Performance includes the STAAR, STAAR Modified, and STAAR Alternate assessments.

**Attendance Rate** Attendance rates reported in the TAPR are based on student attendance for the entire school year.

**Annual Dropout Rate** This is shown for grades 9-12 and grades 7-8.

**Longitudinal Graduation Rates** The following measures are shown:

- *4-Year Longitudinal Rate*, Class of 2014, Class of 2013.
- *5-Year Extended Graduation Rate*, Class of 2013, Class of 2012
- *6-Year Extended Graduation Rate*, Class of 2012, Class of 2011

- *4-Year and 5-Year Federal Graduation Rates Without Exclusions*
- *RHSP/DAP Graduates Longitudinal Rate, Class of 2014, Class of 2013.*
- *RHSP/DAP Graduates Annual Rate, Class of 2014, Class of 2013.*

***Graduates Enrolled in Texas Institution of Higher Education*** Texas Education Code §39.301(c)(11) and (12) require the Agency to report the following indicators:: 1) the percent of students who enroll and begin instruction at an institution of higher education in the school year following high school graduation, and 2) the percent of students who successfully completed the first year of instruction at an institution of higher education without needing a developmental education course.

***Other Performance Indicators*** Other indicators are shown in a similar manner as in prior year reports; see the *TAPR Glossary* for more information.

Texas statute requires that every District makes available to the public the 2013-2014 PEIMS Financial Actual Report. This information is provided by the Division of School Finance at the Texas Education Agency and can be accessed directly through the Texas Education Agency.

#### **3. Campus Performance Objectives.**

*Texas Education Code* §11.253 requires that each campus improvement plan set objectives based on the TAPR and periodically measure progress toward the performance objectives. These objectives must be approved by the local board of trustees and must be included in the published TAPR.

The CISD Board of Trustees approved the district and campus objectives and improvement plans at their October 20, 2015 Board meeting. The district and the campus objectives and improvement plans can be accessed directly through the CISD Web site.

#### **4. Report on Violent or Criminal Incidents.**

Texas statute requires every district to publish a report on violent or criminal incidents at their schools. The content of the report should reflect the requirements in Texas Education Code Chapter 39. These requirements read, in part:

(a) The annual report must ... include:

- a statement of the number, rate, and type of violent or criminal incidents that occurred on each district campus, to the extent permitted under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (20 U.S.C. Section 1232g);
- information concerning school violence prevention and violence intervention policies and procedures that the district is using to protect students;
